Organizational Setting

The Trade and Markets Division monitors and analyses trends in international, regional and national agricultural commodity markets, collecting and disseminating comprehensive market and policy information concerning the major traded commodities and those important to food security. It also undertakes forward looking outlook studies. The Division analyses global issues that affect agricultural trade, including policy analysis of trade measures and agreements, and provides technical support and capacity building to member states in all these areas. Through its Global Information and Early Warning Service, the Division is also responsible for FAO's early warnings on food shortfalls. The Division houses the secretariats of the Committee on Commodity Problems (CCP), nine Intergovernmental Commodity Groups (IGGs) and the Agricultural Market Information System (AMIS).

The post is located in the Group managing the Global Information and Early Warning System (GIEWS).

Reporting Lines

The Senior Economist reports to the Director, Trade and Markets Division (EST).

Technical Focus

Under the overall guidance of the Director, Trade and Markets Division the incumbent will lead and coordinate activities undertaken by the Group managing the Global Information and Early Warning System (GIEWS) in monitoring food security at regional and country levels and alerting governments and the international community to impending critical food insecurity situation

Leadership and conceptual thinking for the development and implementation of comprehensive technical, statistical and/or analytical frameworks to support the programme of work and related products, projects and services in accordance with the FAO Strategic Framework

Key Functions

- Plans, manages, or leads highly specialized or multi-disciplinary teams, leads, coordinates, and/or participates on Organization-wide, cross-Departmental committees, project teams, and working groups, and/or provides technical leadership/secretariat services on technical networks and/or international technical policy and standard setting bodies.
- Analyses global and country specific requirements as well as agricultural, economic, social, environmental factors to
 provide critical input into the FAO Strategic Framework, Programme of Work as well as Detailed Work Plans and the
 supporting budgets and/or resourcing strategies.
- Implements and monitors work programmes involving the conception and development of comprehensive statistical and/or analytical frameworks including early warning, medium and long term plans and strategies, leading edge tools, methods, systems and databases, critical indicators, and/or policy models, etc.
- Oversees and reviews data collection, validation, analysis and reporting activities to support the development of technical standards, international instruments, innovation, FAO flagship publications/yearbooks, and/or on-going programme development as well as technical and/or policy advisory services.
- Provides technical and policy advice to Member Countries and technical support to decentralized offices in the development and implementation of their programmes of work.
- Plans, organizes and participates in capacity development activities involving the provision of advice, technical assistance
 projects, training workshops, seminars, and meetings as well as oversees the development of related materials, on-line
 tools and information kits.
- Represents the Organization at international/inter-governmental meetings and conferences, advocates strategic partnerships, best practices, and increased policy dialogue and develops and negotiates effective working relationships/consensus and agreements with international and national partners.
- Leads and/or participates in resource mobilization activities in accordance with the Corporate strategy.

Specific Functions

Plans and coordinates the work of the regional and thematic GIEWS Teams, overseeing and providing guidance to the

- staff of the Teams:
- Oversees and monitors the preparation and dissemination by the GIEWS Teams of the printed or electronic reports published through GIEWS;
- Oversees and monitors the maintenance and enhancement of GIEWS information databases to support internal analysis
 and reporting, and ensure their availability as a public good where appropriate, assuring latest technical standards;
- Supports the organization and realization of Crop and Food Security Assessment Missions (CFSMs) to countries facing food difficulties upon Government requests;
- Contributes to the methodological work of GIEWS for monitoring, analysing, early warning and reporting on food security, as well as to the continuous development of the computerized databases of GIEWS:
- Plans, organizes and participates in capacity development at regional and country level for the provision of technical assistance on GIEWS methodologies and tools for food security monitoring and assessment;
- Advises FAO Representatives on food security monitoring and assessment methods and tools, and maintains close contacts with senior officials of governments, international and bilateral aid agencies and institutions and Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs);

Minimum Requirements

- Advanced university degree in economics, agricultural economics, agriculture or a related field
- Ten years of relevant experience in economic analysis and assessment of food security including agricultural markets, trade and policies for basic foods in developing countries
- Working knowledge of English, French or Spanish and limited knowledge of one of the other two or Arabic, Chinese, Russian
