

Problems in implementation

- Insufficient experience in contracting = problems
- Changes of the dossier, filling in legal templates
- Submission prescribed forms, attachments and supporting documents
- Issue the necessary permits related to construction
- The mismatch of project applications with the objectives of the Call
- Inadequate quality of applications
- Financial capacity of applicants failure to provide co-financing
- Processing of applications time consuming and complicated









Lessons learned

- Strategic planning and programming
- National priorities clearly defined for multi-annual period
- Consensus about the priorities at the governmental level
- Concentration of resources (needs always exceed available funds)
- Early consultations with partners in the identification of priorities
- Importance of preliminary agreement with EC on funding areas and priorities







Lessons learned

- Administrative capacity
- Clear distribution of roles and responsibilities
- Fulfilment of auditors' findings and strict respect of deadlines
- Sufficient number of staff
- Staff retention policy
- Support from state oficials level
- Continuous training for project preparation and implementation
- Capacity building at regional and local level for strategic planning, project preparation and implementation (joint regional projects)
